Sister Ann Shields, SGL, is a noted speaker and author whose activities as an internationally known evangelist have taken her to Eastern Europe, Africa, Australia, New Zealand, the Caribbean, Central America, Israel, the Philippines, China and the British Isles, as well as numerous cities in the United States and Canada.

Based in Ann Arbor, Sister Ann is a member of the Servants of God's Love, a charismatic religious community canonically established in the Diocese of Lansing, Michigan.

Sr. Ann served in higher education for eighteen years as an English instructor and as head of college campus ministry. She is currently the host of a daily radio program, *Food for the Journey*, heard on 65 stations in the U.S.



A frequent speaker at national and international conferences, Sister Ann Shields has authored *Deeper Conversion*, *Pray and Never Lose Heart*, *What Am I Living For?*, *Yielding to the Power of God*, *Fire in My Heart*, *God Answers Prayer*, *God's Severe Mercy: The Signs of the Times*, and has co-authored *And Their Eyes Were Opened: Encountering Jesus in the Sacraments* with Fr. Michael Scanlan, TOR. Most recently she has authored *Deeper Conversion* (2008) and *To Be Like Jesus--Reflections on the Gospel of Luke* (2010).

Rabbi Dr. Mark Kinzer

“Preparing for Jesus in the Old Testament”

Rabbi Mark S. Kinzer (PhD, University of Michigan) is the Spiritual Leader of Congregation Zera Avraham, a Messianic Jewish synagogue in Ann Arbor Michigan. From 1976 to 1990 Rabbi Kinzer was a coordinator of the Word of God, an ecumenical charismatic community in Ann Arbor serving the international charismatic renewal.



Since the early 1990's Rabbi Kinzer has taken an active role in the Messianic Jewish movement, and is now widely regarded as the movement's foremost theologian. He is founder, Senior Scholar, and President Emeritus of Messianic Jewish Theological, a graduate school with centers in Jerusalem and Los Angeles. Rabbi Kinzer has participated in the Roman Catholic – Messianic Jewish Dialogue Group since its

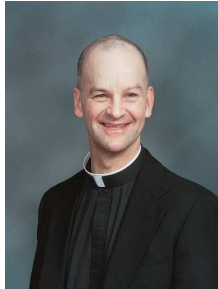
inception in 2000. This group of Roman Catholic and Messianic Jewish leaders, summoned originally by Georges Cardinal Cottier, Theologian of the Papal Household under His Holiness Pope John Paul II, and now overseen by Christoph Cardinal Schönborn of Vienna, Austria, meets annually, rotating between Rome and Jerusalem. Rabbi Kinzer is the author of *Postmissionary Messianic Judaism: Redefining Christian Engagement with the Jewish People* (Brazos, 2005) and *Israel's Messiah and the People of God* (Cascade, 2011).

Fr. Dan Jones

“The Mass is the Sacrifice of Jesus”

Fr. Daniel Jones is a priest of the Archdiocese of Detroit, Assistant Professor of Theology, and Director of Graduate Seminarians.



Born in 1953 in Detroit, he received a B.A. from the University of Michigan (history) in 1975, and lived as a member of The Servants of the Word, a lay brotherhood, for 15 years. He served in a variety of apostolates, working in European missions (Brussels and London) for five years, and as a junior high school teacher (Ypsilanti, MI) for nine years. During those years he obtained an M.A. in Education and an M.A. in English from Eastern Michigan University.

He began priestly studies for the Archdiocese of Detroit in 1992, and received an S.T.B. from the Pontifical Gregorian University (Rome) in 1996. He was ordained to the priesthood in 1997, and then received an S.T.L., Diploma, and S.T.D. (2003) in Theology and Patristic Sciences from the Augustinianum Patristics Institute, Rome. He recently published *Christus Sacerdos in the Preaching of St. Augustine: Christ and Christian Identity* (Frankfurt: Peter Lang, 2004).

At Sacred heart Seminary, Fr. Jones teaches a course on the Mass. He also serves as weekend assistant at St. Anthony Parish in Belleville. He has given numerous retreats and seminars for religious, priests, seminarians, and laity in the USA and abroad.

Dr. Ralph Martin

“Transformation in Jesus”

Ralph is the president of Renewal Ministries (www.renewalministries.net), an organization devoted to Catholic renewal and evangelization. Renewal Ministries is the sponsor of “The Choices We Face” a widely viewed weekly Catholic television and radio program distributed throughout the world and engages in a wide variety of mission work in more than 27 countries.



He is also the Director of Graduate Theology Programs in Evangelization and an assistant professor of theology at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in the Archdiocese of Detroit. He holds a doctorate in theology from the Angelicum University in Rome.

He is the author of a number of books the most recent of which is *The Fulfillment of All Desire: A Guidebook for the Journey to God Based on the Wisdom of the Saints*. He and his wife Anne reside in Ann Arbor, Michigan, and are members of Christ the King Parish.

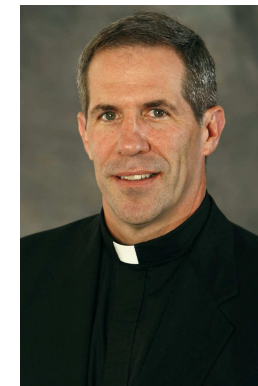

Bishop Michael Byrnes

“Jesus is the Living Word”

Michael Jude Byrnes was born in 1958 in Detroit. Bishop Byrnes earned a degree in microbiology at U. of M. in 1979. Active in the Charismatic Renewal movement, he served as office manager for the outreach group Servant Ministries in Ann Arbor from 1985 until 1990. He entered formation at Sacred Heart Major Seminary in Detroit in 1990, where he later earned a Master of Divinity degree and a Master of Arts degree with a concentration in Scripture. He was ordained May 25, 1996.

Bishop Byrnes began his priestly ministry as associate pastor at St. Joan of Arc Parish in St. Clair Shores and as an adjunct faculty member at Sacred Heart Major Seminary. He served in those roles until 1999, at which time he departed to Rome to study at the Pontifical Gregorian University. He earned his Doctorate in Sacred Theology (STD) in 2003. Returning to Detroit, he joined the faculty of Sacred Heart Major Seminary. In January 2004, he was named vice rector of Sacred Heart Major Seminary and also pastor of Presentation/Our Lady of Victory, where Deacon Hubert Sanders is the deacon administrator. He holds those posts to the current day.



Additionally, between 2007 and 2009, he served on the archdiocesan Presbyteral Council. Among Bishop Byrnes’s passions is participating in marathons and triathlons. Last year, at his encouragement, dozens of seminarians took part in the annual Detroit marathon.
